The Howards: Bringing Home Elizabeth by adoptive parent and former court appointed advocate volunteer Kyle Howard

Several years ago, I moved back home to Houston and decided to find a volunteer activity that would allow me to give back to the community. I read about Child Advocates and after attending an orientation session, I immediately knew that I had found the right opportunity. During my time as a court appointed advocate, I worked on two cases and was asked to speak on behalf of Child Advocates at several training classes and at corporate recruiting events. Being able to make a difference in the lives of the children involved gave me a feeling of accomplishment that is hard to put into words, but I didn't realize at the time how much Child Advocates would truly impact my life.

In 2006, my wife Barbara and I decided to adopt a child and we'd begun to explore our options and next steps. About that same time, I met an old friend for lunch to catch up. She told me that her niece had given birth to a little girl she wasn't able to take care of. CPS had gotten involved and, after initially trying to reunify the mother and child, placed the little girl in a foster home.

My friend and her husband have a wonderful home and five beautiful children of their own. Although they loved this little girl and were considering taking her in temporarily, they weren't sure that they would be able to provide a permanent home for her. I didn't mention that we were considering adoption until after I had a chance to call Barbara and explain the situation, but Barbara was thrilled with the possibility. I called my friend back and we set up a time to meet the little girl.

I vividly remember every moment of the first time that we met Elizabeth. The way she was dressed, the way she smiled at Barbara and sat on her lap. I remember the way her eyes blinked when she looked at me and the sound of her voice as she squealed at her cousin across the table. We were totally taken by her.

The details of the case were daunting. The mother's whereabouts were unknown, one paternity test was negative and a second candidate had been identified. There was another relative interested in caring for her as well, but due to background check issues, was not a likely candidate.

My background as a volunteer helped prepare me for the ups-and-downs of going through a case like this, but upon meeting Smitty Snodgrass, the court appointed advocate volunteer assigned to Elizabeth's case, as well as Smitty's advocacy coordinator Kay Anderson, I knew we were in especially good hands. It was immediately clear that Smitty knew all of the case details and each party involved. She was able to provide us with clear and honest information. I really respect her dedication to her work and genuinely appreciated her candor in explaining all of the possible (continued on next page)

outcomes as the case took new twists and turns. One of the most important parts of the process was our home study. Smitty and Kay were able to expedite things by performing the home study themselves and then submitting it to CPS for approval. This allowed us to have Elizabeth placed in our home months earlier than if we had to wait for another agency to perform the task. I can't express how much that meant to us.

As the final hearing approached, the results of the paternity test had come in and the father was identified. He gave up his parental rights voluntarily and, because the mother had not been heard from for several months, her rights were terminated by the court due to abandonment. Elizabeth's attorney asked that she be placed with us until the adoption could be finalized. It couldn't have been a happier ending.

There are several moments of that day that stand out in my mind: hearing the judge agree to give us custody, listening to the caseworker testify that we would provide a good home for Elizabeth, seeing the smiles on Smitty and Kay's faces and giving each of them a hug. I can never adequately thank them for what they've done for our family. But I know from my own experience as an advocate that the rewards you receive for your efforts go beyond the simple thanks that you get from the families. It's the sense of satisfaction of knowing that you have made a positive impact in the life of someone who really needed it. The case may only last a year, but the results last a lifetime.

I should tell you that Elizabeth had her second birthday in October and it was spent surrounded by family and loved ones. She takes swimming lessons, speaks Spanish and English and is genuinely one of the happiest and most sociable little children that I've ever seen. She is the absolute joy of our lives.







Thrive

Roy and Tammie Gordon recount the story of adopting their son, Malik – with a happy ending due, in part, to the tireless efforts of court appointed advocate volunteer Carl Stutts:

Having grown up on the street where Malik's birth mother's family lived, Tammie had known them for over thirty years. When the birth mother became pregnant, her family approached us about possibly adopting the child upon its birth. We accepted the offer and helped the birth mother with everything she needed throughout the pregnancy. Unfortunately, after delivering Malik, she changed her mind and said she wanted to keep the baby.

Our hopes to become Malik's parents were dashed until we were contacted by Child Protective Services. Malik was in their custody due to skull fractures he suffered at the hands of someone the mother had allowed to care for him. We were told he had been placed in a foster home and that Child Advocates was assigned to the case. Malik's court appointed advocate, Carl Stutts, was wonderful; he helped us understand the court procedures and when we had issues with CPS, he was there to support us every step of the way. With Carl's help, we met with Malik's doctors and were thrilled to hear that, although he suffered severe trauma, he would likely make a full recovery.

Malik was placed in our home at three months. As the case progressed, there was a possibility that the mother's parental rights would not be terminated, as she was cooperating with the courts and participating in some of her required services. Although we had mixed emotions and were unsure of the outcome, we continued to do what we believed best for Malik. It was during these months that Child Advocates and Carl were so beneficial; he was there every time we took Malik to family visits at the CPS offices, every court hearing, and he even came to visit us at our home several times to check on Malik's progress.

Eventually, the birth mother relinquished her parental rights and we were able to move forward with Malik's adoption. He has been in our home now for fifteen months and we just love him. It is so wonderful to see him so active and energetic and to see how quickly he learns. We are delighted by his progress and believe that his recovery is a success story in itself.
